Sidewalk Repairs

Dear Neighbors,

We are exploring options to getting our sidewalks repaired to fix trip hazards. Our slabs are basically in pretty good shape, but some have settled or raised causing uneven walkway panels. There is no money left from the 2006 Bond. If we are to have the city fix them, we will need to pass a new bond. However, there is no guarantee that any of that money will find its way to our neighborhood as we are still considered a "new" neighborhood, even though we are about 30 years old.

The city has assessed \$1.3 million in repairs needed in our neighborhood but older neighborhoods will most likely use up new bond funds for repairs which means we will have to wait for yet another

bond after that one. More than likely, we might get our sidewalks ramped at cross streets to meet ADA requirements.

The city has contracted with several companies who will replace your panels at about \$100 per panel. I have explored using a company specializing in leveling concrete by mud-jacking the panels into alignment for my own sidewalk. Personally, I like this option as it does not give a patch-work quilt appearance to the neighborhood. I am trying to see if there might be some funds from other departments and programs to get some help with this.

If you have any interest in fixing your sidewalk panels, please contact me by e-mail. If there are

enough of us, we might be able to get our panels leveled at a discounted price from this company. With enough interest, a representative would be willing to come to our NNO meeting to answer questions. The city might possibly be willing to support this sidewalk leveling if we have at least 20 or more willing to do it. I want to try to keep the cost at \$50 per panel which is better than the city's contacts. Be aware, each homeowner is responsible for the condition of the sidewalk in front of your house.

Calloway's Timely Tip for October

As September gives way to the cooler days of October, this is a good time to evaluate your landscape. Did you know that fall is one of the best times to plant trees, shrubs and perennials? Nursery stock planted now will have an opportunity for roots to settle in and become established. When spring arrives, this root system can support and take full advantage of the surge of new growth. Fresh nursery stock is arriving daily so, stop by and take advantage of the selection available and this wonderful time of the year to work outdoors!

We are also excited about more heirloom bulbs from The Southern Bulb Company. Remember, this is the Texas company known for searching out and rescuing "lost and forgotten" varieties. The *Leucojum aestivum*, better known as "Snowflakes", is by far one of the most adaptable bulbs

ever offered in Texas. Clusters of dime-sized blooms emerge in February accented by bluish green foliage. The 'Grand Primo' Narcissus is treasured for its long lasting blooms and robust foliage. This reliable bloomer's fragrance is light and sweet and the flowers appear in late February through March. 'Golden Dawn' Narcissus grows 14" -16" tall and is multi-flowering. Enjoy a sweet, clean fragrance year after year usually in mid-March. As a good "rule of thumb" for most bulbs, plant at a depth about three times the height of the bulb.

Also, new this fall is a program which offers the early purchase of pre-chilled bulbs. Several varieties of Tulips, Narcissus and Hyacinths are available for purchasing now with delivery in December-ready to go into the ground. Gardening made easy!

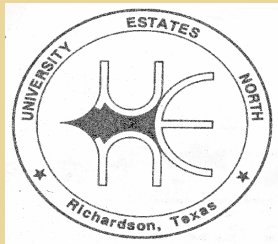
