Dial 211 for Flu Advice



You can now dial 2-1-1 to receive over-the-phone medical guidance about what you should do if you or a family member have flu symptoms.

The state's 2-1-1 health information helpline is now staffed with medical professionals who can provide information about managing flu symptoms and advice on when to seek medical care from a physician or emergency room.

This will help you make informed decisions about how to care for yourself and your family. The guidance is not intended to

replace specific instructions people receive from their physicians.

The 2-1-1 staff also can provide general flu information and vaccine availability information for individuals and health care providers. Calls are answered round-the-clock. Callers are instructed to choose a language and then press "6" for flu information and guidance.

Basic flu symptoms include fever, cough and sore throat that usually come on suddenly. Most cases are relatively mild to moderate and do not need emergency treatment.

Most people who have H1N1 flu or seasonal flu just need appropriate fluid intake, fever-reducing medication, rest and careful monitoring, Lakey said. Recovering at home also lessens the burden on the health care system.

People with underlying health conditions who think they

have the flu should contact their health care provider.

Fall Gardening

GET READY FOR OCTOBER/NOVEMBER GARDENING TASKS

Cut back perennial herbs to encourage well branched growth next year. A plant or two of parsley taken from the garden will do well in a sunny window. Chives, sage and thyme will also do well.

To save caladium tubers, dig them up late this month. Allow to dry completely and store in vermiculite or similar material.

Prune damaged or diseased branches from shrubs and trees in late fall or early winter. Dispose of debris to minimize disease carry-over to spring.

Rake regularly and begin compost piles. Clean up around perennials. Dispose of leaves and stems on the ground which can harbor disease or provide hiding places

for pests.

Mulch plants to protect roots and conserve moisture.

Plant a cover crop of legumes in used sections of the flower and vegetable garden. In early spring, till under to provide extra nitrogen to new crops.

Fall is the best time for planting trees and shrubs. Nurseries

have a good selection now. Consider buying some for the fall color they will provide or for the interest the bark or shape may bring to the winter landscape.


