As a volunteer with the Richardson Police Department, I attend a quarterly update meeting conducted by Chief Jimmy Spivey. At a recent meeting he made it official – crime IS down in Richardson. This is remarkable because crime rates had previously dropped to levels thought by some to be at or close to the minimums for a community of our size. By comparison, crime rates are consistently higher in communities around us. Oh, about that volunteer work with RPD – it's really exciting. I get to shuttle police vehicles to and from the service center off of Plano Rd. (no playing with lights and sirens, no handling of the guns).

Our neighborhood membership on the **Nextdoor.com** website continues to grow. We now have 256 individuals signed up representing 188 residences. That's 60% of the homes in UEN. **Nextdoor.com** is a fantastic resource for all of us. Think of it as that bulletin board we used to see in the grocery story with all kinds of notes posted with things for sale, lost/found pets, help wanted, recommendations, and lots more. Our Nextdoor site shares information with almost 2,400 people living in the neighborhoods immediately around us. Very important for all of us – Richardson Police Department uses Nextdoor to share safety and community information as well as get crime alerts out to us. REDISCOVERING OUR COMMUNITY

"Everything you want is on the other side of fear." (Jack Canfield, author) Overcoming fear is what Crime Watchers and the police are all about. On National Night Out we will get to meet these people who watch over us. As Joe Biden, Vice President, says, "National Night Out brings neighbors together with the people who protect them." This annual event sends a message to criminals letting them know that our neighborhood is organized and fighting back.

As grateful as we are for those entrusted with law enforcement, perhaps the greatest deterrent to crime is a closely knit community. Kay Bailey Hutchinson, past U.S. Senator, says, "The best way to prevent crime is to know your neighbors. National Night Out is an opportunity to come out of your isolation and rediscover your community."

The key question in community building is, "So, how are you doing?" When was the last time you said that to your neighbor? All around you are people who need your encouragement: a neighbor kid whose mom needs a break, young parents who miss having the grandparents around, a neighbor who just lost their job, immigrants who feel terribly alone because of the language barrier, the elderly who struggle with depression due to sickness and the fear of losing their independence, etc.

Caring for the weak and discouraged is at the heart of community building. Dietrich Bonhoeffer said, "Only when the smallest link is in place will the chain be unbroken." And, to quote another person, "Snowflakes are frail, but when enough of them stick together they can stop traffic." Together we can be a powerful force in combating crime.

Police protection and a closely knit community are a blessing. But don't forget someone else who is watching over us. Let's be thankful for God's protection! We can't "see around the corner" but He can. Put your hope in him. Every night we go to bed without any assurance of being alive the next morning but we still set the alarm. That's hope.

Yard of the Month Winners for July, August and September

Usher in the autumn season with creative displays for indoors and out! Transformation quickly occurs with pots of mums, pansies, cabbages and ornamental peppers when combined with pumpkins, gourds and bales of hay.

Create a spectacular vignette in your landscape with bales of hay, a scarecrow or two, multiple sizes of pumpkins and gourds, pots of garden mums, corn stalks and for more texture consider adding old tools, a set of antlers or birdhouses. The autumn color palette offers a myriad of wonderful colors from which to choose; purples, rusts, gold's, yellows, oranges, deep greens and browns can be used. Whether you are mixing colors or working with only one, use color abundantly to create massive appeal. Create a pyramid of pumpkins and gourds by selecting different colors and stacking them one on top of the other. Simply displaying a "pile" of pumpkins in the same color palette and different sizes will draw ones eye and interest to an area of your landscape.

Color Creations filled with blooming or colorful foliage plants can be used on patios and porches. Freshen up existing containers by nestling an interesting pumpkin or gourd in amongst the plants. Fill a favorite basket or pot with a mixture of produce for a simple, impressive look. Add a bit of nature into your containers with branches, corn husks, berries and other materials to enhance the overall look. If you did not apply a pre-emergent herbicide to your lawn in September; apply it by the first two weeks of October. You should also fertilize your St. Augustine or Bermuda lawns no later than the first week of October.

October is bulb buying month. They are in fresh supply and will provide welcome late winter and early spring color for the landscape. Refrigerate Tulips and Hyacinth bulb for at least 45 to 60 days to provide enough chilling to bloom properly. Plant them in late November or early December.
